

To celebrate National **Biodiversity Week, IPCC** hosted a number of events beginning with a walk, talk and day of action on Lullymore West. The first Marsh Fritillary was spotted, and members of the public got first hand experience in site management by setting up a temporary electric fence in preparation for the arrival of the local conservation donkeys. Biodiversity week continued with a walk and talk on Girley Bog, Co. Meath. Participants

discovered peatland flora and fauna including a spectacular male Emperor Moth and Small Tortoiseshell butterfly caterpillars feeding on nettles.

IPCC & the Móin Fhionnúrach Development Association hosted a walk and talk on Fenor Bog, Co. Waterford. Green-veined White butterflies, Ragged Robin and Ireland's only lizard, the Viviparous Lizard, were some of wildlife observed. IPCC have more events that you can take in this summer. 


Species Focus



An IPCC supporter encountered the Wall Brown (*Lasiommata magera*) on Lullymore West this May. The butterfly was recorded previously in 2018 and 2013 with only a single butterfly each time. The Wall Brown is very alert and difficult to approach from a close distance, however if you do the butterfly is mainly pale orange with grayish-brown markings and black eyespots.

Habitat Management

IPCC welcomed back Daisy and Ruby, a mother and daughter duo who graze Lullymore West nature reserve by eating the vegetation and creating various sward heights necessary for the Marsh Fritillary butterfly, Ireland's only protected insect. The donkeys also create pockets of bare peat which allows the larvae food plant, Devil's-bit Scabious to grow.

Monitoring fauna and water levels on Girley Bog Co.Meath



With funding support from the Peatlands Community Engagement Scheme, IPCC are undertaking an assessment of the water piezometers on the IPCC owned section of Girley Bog, Co.Meath. This is part of a project to re-instate water level monitoring after enhanced rehabilitation works in 2021. IPCC are also working to complete a baseline



biodiversity survey across the high and cut bog post rehabilitation with support from volunteers and Meath County Council under the Community Heritage Grants Scheme 2022. Join IPCC on our next visit to Girley. Contact IPCC at bogs@ipcc.ie for more information!


